'God is Love'

In today's second reading we hear the three most important words in the entire Bible, 'God is Love'.

Today's world has so many theories about what it means to love, love is freedom, love is the ability to do whatever you want without any consequences, love is not having to say you're sorry. However, for Christians love is only one thing - God! Without God there is no love, without God we are not capable of love, so it's not surprising that a Godless society is desperate to find love anywhere else and all they find is bitterness, anger and hatred. We are constantly being told to love in the most unloving ways!

The night before Jesus died He gave us a single commandment to live by, 'Love one another as I have loved you'. In today's Gospel He makes it clear how He loves us, 'a man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends'. When He tells us to love one another as He loves us He doesn't mean preaching to each other or trying to perform miracles or even asking for miracles, He means to lay down our lives for each other.

Hope do we lay down our lives for each other? By learning to be humble! We lay down our lives for each other by not being bitter, or getting angry or through hatred. We lay down our lives for each other by washing each other's feet, by getting to know each other properly and not demanding other people be more like us, by looking after the needs of others rather than putting our own needs first.

In today's first reading St Peter comes to the house of Cornelius to baptise him and his entire household (family and servants). When St Peter approaches the house Cornelius falls to the ground before him and St Peter says two things, 'Stand up, I am only a man after all' and, 'The truth I have now come to realise is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God does what is right is acceptable to Him.' In the Gospel Jesus says He no longer calls us servants but friends because He has told us everything the Father wants us to know and a servant does not know his master's business. God doesn't prefer any person over another because we are His friends and He loves us, as long as we remain in His love by obeying His singles commandment to love one another as He loves us!
